About the Play

This modern adaptation of a Japanese folktale and supernatural mystery follows one man's journey through love and loss. Born into a society steeped in ancient traditions and ultra-modern culture, Isamu, a lonely, unmarried man, is an outlier. His loving and exasperated mother does not let him forget it. A horrific event years ago leads him deeper into isolation. He starts to write a manga, a graphic novel. But he cannot finish it. What is he writing about? And what does Mt. Fuji have to do with any of this?

About the Playwright

Cathy Midori Stonie started writing in 2016, taking classes at Stagebridge with playwright Anthony Clarvoe. Her inspirations come from foreign journeys and observing ordinary people living their extraordinary lives. Cathy hails from Los Angeles, and has lived in Honolulu, San Francisco, and now in San Jose for 26 years with her husband. She has two sons. She is a member of Theatre Bay Area, and Board member of Playwrights' Center of San Francisco (PCSF) since 2020. In 2020, her full-length play, "A Rose by Any Other Name," about Tokyo Rose, had a virtual reading. A short play, "Pandemic in Love," was included in Smith and Kraus anthology, "Laughter is the Best Medicine: Forty-five 5-minute plays in the time of coronavirus," published in 2021. She had a developmental reading of "You'll Never Look at Mt. Fuji the Same Again," in 2021 with PCSF. In the summer of 2022, Cathy co-produced a virtual "BIPOC Showcase of Short Plays" for PCSF, to promote a more diverse membership at PCSF. Four of her short plays were presented on zoom by Bay Area acting troupe, Drama with Friends, in June 2023. Cathy was thrilled and honored to be selected for the 2023 Brady Fellow with 3Girls Theatre, and looks forward to invaluable collaboration with talented artists and leaders.

Keiko Shimosato Carreiro (Director) is a Collective Member, actor, designer, co-writer, and director with the Tony Award-winning San Francisco Mime Troupe. She has performed at American Conservatory Theater, Berkeley Repertory, The Magic Theater, San Jose Stage, The Aurora Theater, Word for Word, Oakland Theater Project, Center Rep., and Marin Shakespeare Company. In 2020 Keiko Co-founded *Kunoichi Productions* (Female Ninja productions) innovative, multidisciplinary theater combining Eastern and Western Theater Traditions.Most recently, she Co-Directed an Immersive Production of *A Strange Library* by Haruki Murakami for Word for Word at Z-Below.

Nick Ishimaru (Choreographer) is a co-founder of Kunoichi Productions. Prior to working with Kunoichi, he served as the Artistic Director of Theatre of Yugen from 2016 to 2020. He holds a BA in Performing Arts from Colorado State University, where he directed a kabuki adaptation of Macbeth, a Masters in Drama from San Francisco State University, and did additional doctorate work at the University of Hawaii. He has trained in noh and kyōgen for over 10 years with Theatre of Yugen, and Theatre Nohgaku and the Kita school noh master Oshima Teruhisa in Tokyo. Ishimaru has also studied kabuki, jingju (Beijing Opera), and nihon buyo (traditional Japanese dance). He also has led master classes for all levels from elementary school through university and has presented work at conferences and university lectures both in the Bay Area and internationally.

Founded in 2011 to challenge gender bias within theater, we provide dedicated support to a cohort that is multiracial, multigenerational, and includes cis and trans women, gender non-conforming artists, and trans men.

The 2025 New Works Festival is a celebratory culmination of new plays by women+ playwrights whose work has been in development through 3GT's Reading Series. In honor of our partnership with KALW, our theme is Seen and Heard.

3GT's Reading Series supports emerging SF Bay Area playwrights who have been historically excluded from having their work produced: women over 40; Black, Indigenous, and women of color (BIWOC); and LBTQI+ women and artists assigned-female-at-birth. We provide everything a playwright needs to succeed, including paid dramaturgs, directors, casts, performance venue, and marketing support.

Less than 30% of new plays produced by the American mainstream theatre establishment in any year are written by women. We're proud to be one of the very few theatre companies in the nation that develop and present only plays written by women+.
